### What can parents/carers do?

- ✓ Make sure you are aware of the benefits of our school dress code and discuss these with your child.
- ✓ Stay committed to it – sometimes the road may be rocky, but it is worth showing your determination.
- ✓ Keep in contact with the school and other parents/carers; a united approach will reinforce our messages to children and young people.
- ✓ If you are contacted by the school to inform you that your child has not worn any or part of the approved dress code, discuss it with your child; set out your expectations and revisit the benefits.
- ✓ Praise your child for supporting our dress code. Link it to what are often dress code expectations in the workplace.

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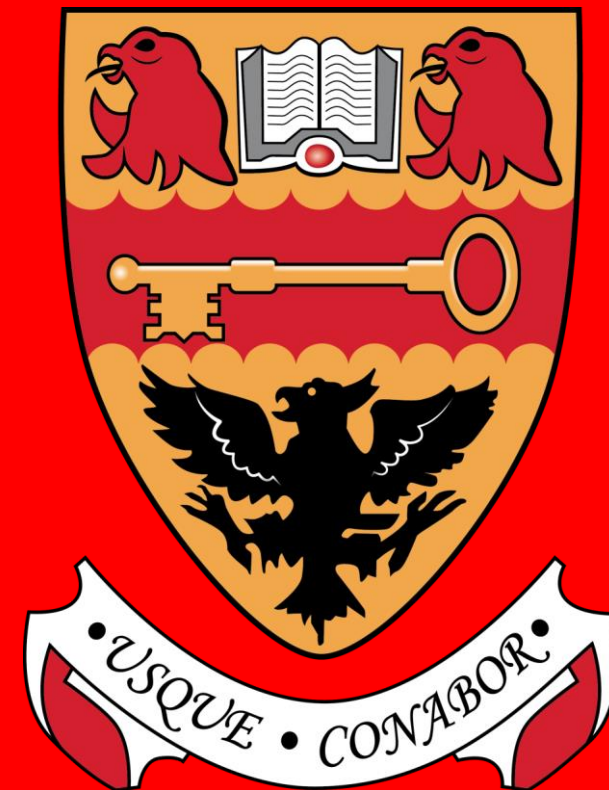

## Dressing for Excellence

At Lasswade High School our school values are Creativity, Effort, Kindness and Respect. These underpin our expectations for student actions and behaviours.

A school dress code is an important way of reinforcing our values and drive for excellence. How these values link to our dress code rationale are shown in brackets below.

Lasswade High School expects and strongly encourages all students to follow our dress code since it can:

- ✓ contribute to school security and personal safety (Respect)
- ✓ promote a positive and professional work ethic (Effort)
- ✓ help students to see school as a place of learning (Effort & Creativity)
- ✓ support positive behaviour, equity and discipline (Kindness)
- ✓ encourage our collective Lasswade identity, and support our positive school ethos (Respect)
- ✓ promote equality of opportunity and social justice (Kindness)
- ✓ protect young people from social pressures, e.g., to dress in a fashion oriented or expensive way (Respect & Kindness)
- ✓ nurture cohesion and promote good relations between different groups of students (Respect & Kindness)

Our Student Support Team will discuss the importance of dress code with all students. They, and members of our SLT, are committed to working with families to ensure that students follow our dress code expectations.

We will engage with families in a way that reflects our values ensuring that practical, solution-focused approaches, to realise our aim of all students complying with our dress code expectations are achieved.

## Dress Code 'Vision'

We expect our students' clothing, and footwear to be a mixture of black and white with at least one item of clothing displaying our school logo/badge.

**Compulsory items:** all LHS students are expected to wear:

- ✓ at least one of our LHS 'branded' school tie, blazer, t-shirt, polo shirt or quarter-zip top
- ✓ all upper body clothing items must be plain black or white
- ✓ lower body clothing items must be black
- ✓ shoes must be plain black and/or white
- ✓ no logos should be displayed other than the school's badge/logo
- ✓ the school's logo/badge must be on clear display at all times when students are within the school building

**Senior Phase items:** a more formal approach is encouraged for our Senior Phase students, including

- ✓ Shirt/Blouse; Trousers/Skirt; Black shoes
- ✓ LHS School blazer and tie

Please note that those students who are part of our Academy of Performing Arts, or Schools of Football, Rugby, Dance and Basketball are permitted to wear their associated 'kit' as part of dress code compliance

**PE Kit:** changing for PE (except swimming) is not required; students can come to school dressed in PE kit on PE days. Students must still meet our compulsory requirements detailed above. Otherwise PE kit consists of:

- ✓ Plain black or white polo shirt or t-shirt
- ✓ Plain black shorts, sports leggings, joggers
- ✓ Sports trainers; if not black and/or white they should be carried and changed into at PE

## Dressing for Excellence

All students are expected to bring necessary equipment to support learning which includes:

- ✓ School Bag
- ✓ Pencil Case/Calculator
- ✓ Water bottle (optional)
- ✓ Chromebook

There are forms of dress which are **unacceptable** and **not** part of our uniform.

For example:

- ✗ Ripped jeans
- ✗ immodest style or design worn in a manner that could cause offence to others
- ✗ stiletto heels or platform shoes.
- ✗ loose fitting clothing, flammable clothing, certain types of piercing/ear rings that could be a health and safety hazard

We expect outside wear (i.e. jackets/caps/hats/scarves etc.) to be removed when in the building.

The last Friday of each month will usually be designated a Dress Down Day. Students can either follow regular dress code expectations or, by making a contribution (£1.00 suggested), can opt to dress down and wear smart/casual clothing to school. Contributions can be made via ParentPay.

The monies collected will be split 1/3rd to the school fund (to benefit all our students) and the remaining 2/3rds to support a local, national or international charity identified by our students in conjunction with staff.
